**January 28 - April 23, 2006**

### ***Ben Franklin's Curious Mind***

Celebrating the tercentenary of the birth of Benjamin Franklin, this exhibition highlights some of his remarkable accomplishments – as printer, writer, scientist, inventor, citizen and statesman -- and brings his work to life with hands-on interactive displays based on his inventions and achievements. ### ***Animals in Winter: Survival at Zero Degrees***

**February 4 - March 19, 2006**

### ***Landscapes: Selections from the Bruce Museum Collection***

The exhibition highlights 30 paintings from the permanent collection of the Bruce Museum of Arts and Science that show the appeal and seasonal beauty of the American panorama. The Museum collection focuses on 19<sup>th</sup>- and 20<sup>th</sup>-century views of the Northeast, from the Connecticut shoreline to the tree-lined lakes of the Adirondacks. ### ***Hands-on Caving***

**May 13 - August 27, 2006**

***Best in Show: Dogs in Art from the Renaissance to Today***

This exhibition offers a broad survey of the subject of dogs in Western art from the 17th century to the present. Beginning with the heroic dog paintings of Baroque Italy and Flanders, and progressing to the carefully observed animals of Gerrit Dou and George Stubbs, the alternatively sentimental or bemused works of Sir Edwin Landseer and Rosa Bonheur, the show reveals the remarkable range, quality and variety of the subject of the dog. The exhibition includes images of Impressionist lapdogs and Surrealist hounds and culminates with Pop and cutting-edge Contemporary works of canines. **July 1 - November 26, 2006**

***The Nature of Dogs***

**July 22 - October 22, 2006**

***Jazz Photographs from the Bruce Museum Collection***

**September 16, 2006 - January 10, 2007**

***Jan van der Heyden (1637-1712)***

Jan van der Heyden (1637-1712) was the preeminent Dutch painter of cityscapes and the first artist anywhere to record all the beauty of the urban scene. Approximately 40 paintings with supplemental drawings and prints by this great pioneer of cityscape painting are on view in the first monographic exhibition of Van der Heyden's art to be mounted in seventy years and the first show ever in this country. Following its debut at the Bruce Museum, selections from exhibition will travel to the renowned Rijksmuseum in Amsterdam, The Netherlands. Van der Heyden's prints and drawings will be explored concurrently at the Rembrandthuis. The exhibition is supported by Reed Elsevier and the Charles M. and Deborah G. Royce Exhibition Fund.

**November 11, 2006 - January 10, 2007**

***In Response to Place: Photographs from the Nature Conservancy's Last Great Places***

Striking images by renowned contemporary photographers such as William Wegman, Annie Liebovitz, Lee Friedlander and others of biologically rich landscapes that are the flagship conservation sites of The Nature Conservancy. The Bruce Museum of Arts and Science is located at 1 Museum Drive in Greenwich, Connecticut. It is situated near Interstate-95, Exit 3, and a short walk from the Greenwich, CT rail station. Museum hours are: Tuesday through Saturday 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Sunday 1 p.m. to 5 p.m., and closed Mondays and major holidays. Admission: \$7 for adults, \$6 for seniors and students, and free for children under five and members. Free admission to all on Tuesdays. Groups of eight or more require advance reservations. Museum exhibition tours are held Fridays at 12:30 p.m. Free, on-site parking is available. The Bruce Museum is accessible to individuals with disabilities.
